2010 Census results are in and provide up-to-date counts of Arizona communities.

In addition, other data releases that measure the state population are available for the first time. Although NOT 2010 Census counts, the American Community Survey (ACS) 5 year estimates released in December, 2010, provide timely, detailed statistics about the social, economic, and housing characteristic of every community in Arizona.

We know how important it is for local government professionals to keep current of the latest data available in 2011 in order to plan and assess community services and needs. To help make sense of all the new products, releases and tools, the Census Bureau's Partnership and Data Services team is offering computer lab training exclusively for local government staff.

"Community and Neighborhood Analysis" workshop is designed to provide participants hands-on experience with census.gov in order to look up data to tell their community's story. Participants will learn how to navigate the new American Factfinder (data search tool), the American Community Survey, and the 2010 Census.
